### **Learn about falcons, hawks, and owls during a Winter Falconry Workshop.**

FLAGSTAFF, October 22, 2009. Experience live birds of prey up close and personal in a Winter Falconry Workshop at The Arboretum. Licensed falconers will work with small groups of four to eight participants and teach them about the natural history of hawks, falcons, and owls and the role they play in our environment. Learn the basics of the ancient sport of falconry as well as the environmental concerns facing these beautiful birds. The guided workshop will lead you on an excursion around The Arboretum gardens with an opportunity to handle live birds of prey with close supervision.
