REGISTRATION NOW OPEN FOR ARBORETUM SUMMER CAMPS

Children explore nature in a 200-acre botanical garden and nature center.

FLAGSTAFF, Monday, March 08, 2010. The Arboretum at Flagstaff is now registering children for the 2010 Summer Adventure Programs. Nature-themed camps are designed especially for children aged four through fourteen. A maximum of twelve participants and two adult leaders will spend their time outdoors learning about plants, insects and animals native to northern Arizona. Artist and naturalist Dr. Gwendolyn Waring is back this year to lead “Viewing Nature through an Artist’s Eyes”. This week-long program will use the meadows, forest and wetlands at The Arboretum as artistic inspiration for works in pastel, pen & ink, paint, and sculpture.
